## President's Message

While browsing through a Heritage Quest Magazine, I came across an article on using the Congressional Serial Set for Indian research. This made me wonder how many are aware that a portion of the Serial Set known as "American State papers" resides in the Annex Rare Book Room, and how many have used it. Published between 1837 and 1853 it contains records, papers, debates, reports, etc. of events which occurred in the United States between 1774 and 1837. The set includes volumes on Indian affairs, naval affairs, foreign affairs, military affairs, public lands, and post offices. The volumes are very poorly indexed. The volume on public lands has been indexed in the book *Grassroots of America*, which is in the Annex. Here you will find people making claims for land in the Northwest Territory (now the states of Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, and Wisconsin). Due to the size and age of the volumes you will not be able to make photocopies of pages. Public lands is the exception, as the Annex has a copy of this on microfilm and the post office volume which is a reprint.



Another great set to use in conjunction with the American State papers is the 19v. *Territorial papers of the United States*. Here you will find a 1790 list of American inhabitants of Illinois; lands claimed by the inhabitants of Kaskaskia, including a description of the land and improvements; a census of Vincennes, Indiana; petitions by early settlers; and other reports.

It is in these volumes that I found a great deal of information about my mother-in-law's ancestors. They were very early settlers in Indiana and seemed annoyed to find the area inhabited by Indians. From the petitions they signed and the activities in which they engaged, they were not too fond of Indians. A group of relatives my son would like to disown. They left the east coast just as the Revolution was about to begin, so they did not serve in the war, and then proceeded to kill off as many Indians as they could find in Indiana.

Take a look at these volumes. You may find that elusive ancestor who moved west ahead of all the record keepers, but left a mark in one of the federal records.

Extracted from the original records this index contains over 1,798,000 entries for New York City and 1,550,000 entries for the rest of New York State. Indexed names include every head of household and any person residing in the household with a different surname. Extracted information includes name, age, sex, county, race, birthplace, locality, and the film number and page reference to the original census. Searches can be easily expanded to see every household on a page. Researchers can also extract every family in a given town or county. Each individual data field can be searched enabling a researcher to locate all families of a particular ethnic group or all persons born in a certain state. Wildcard searches can also be performed. A great tool for anyone searching New York.

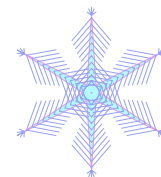

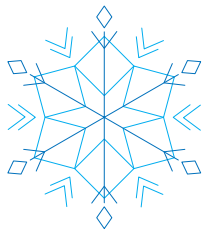

### Post 1901 Canadian Census Project Encounters Major Setback

The Canadian government plans to permanently lock up or destroy all census records made after 1901. Genealogists throughout Canada and in many other countries have been fighting this plan. This week genealogists received a major setback in their efforts. Gordon Watts expressed it well in an e-mail he sent to many concerned observers:

*Greetings All.*

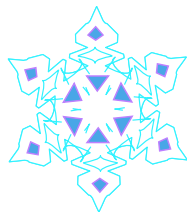
We have today been advised from the office of MP Murray Calder that his Bill C-312 has been deemed to be non-votable. As a result it will receive only one hour of debate in the House of Commons and will then be dropped from the Order paper. This is hardly worthy of a Bill regarding an issue that has received in excess of 40,000 signatures seeking support for public access to Post 1901 Census Records.

This news has been a great disappointment. We had hoped that C-312 would be considered votable and would at least receive the three hours debate allotted to votable Private Member Bills.

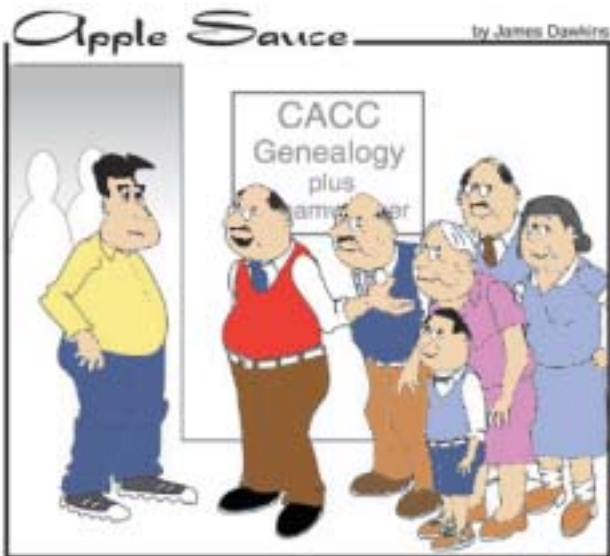

# SCGS Projects Progress Report

## Newsletter Article

The November issue of the newsletter carries an article summarizing the society's work on projects for the past few years. By the end of the year, we will have nine books and one CD-ROM published through Heritage Books. A total of 55 persons have contributed to this effort. There are a number of members who have worked on more than one project, in more than one capacity (abstracting, data entry, proofing), and who have worked continuously from 1998 to the present.

## 1930 School Census

Work is progressing nicely. Coordinator, Annie Conley reports we are more than one-half way through with data entry. The first set of records has been proofed. There is still a need for more volunteers, both data entry and proof readers.

## Newspaper Index

We have received our complimentary copies of the Newspaper Index, vol. II, 1876-1880. Volume III, 1881-1885, is now being advertised in Heritage's pre-publication section at \$30 through No-

vember; the regular price after that will be \$37.50. Work on vol. IV: 1886-1890, continues.

## Naturalization Records

Volume II of our Naturalization Records is now being advertised in Heritage's pre-publication section. It will be priced at \$65, but is available through December at \$52.

## Military Records

Proofing of military records continues. We are probably about half-way through with proofing, but this has taken a secondary place according to needs of other projects.

## School Enrollments

Lois Nimmo continues to enter data for this project.

## Index to Searcher

Good progress is being made on the compilation of SCGS officers, chairmen, and contributors to the Searcher. Fran Murray coordinates the portion of this project that deals with data entry of surnames appearing in the Searcher. Virginia Murphree and Lois Nimmo have both submitted entries for this project.

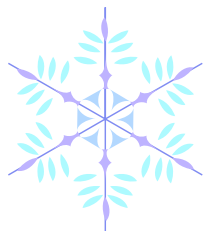

"Grandpa Tucket's Stories" is a section dedicated to children, where Grandpa Tucket teaches about family values using his unusual animals as storytellers.

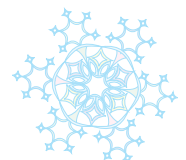
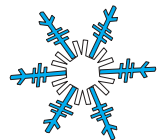
"My Side of the World" features stories about families that made history. "My Side of the World" will be created by a professional storyteller.

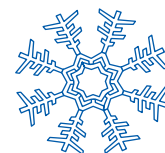
